LET OUR VOICES RING FOR PEACE!

On August 4th, 2022 Hannover will open the gates of the big HCC Domed Hall for choir enthusiasts from all over the world. Be part of the very first **International Week For Peace!**

The idea behind this extraordinary event came from Nicol Matt. The renowned German choral director founded the **World Choir for Peace** under the patronage of the German UNESCO Commission in 2018. This marked the 100th anniversary of the end of the First World War with their first concert in Berlin. 2,000 singers from more than 30 countries came together to sing for peace, performing Karl Jenkins' *The Armed Man*, conducted by the composer himself. Following the outstanding success of the event, the World Choir for Peace became committed to being a musical ambassador for peace worldwide.

Their mission is clear. By bringing together singers from all over the world, the World Choir for Peace contributes to **cultural understanding among all people**.

Hannover has been the home to the World Choir for Peace since 2020 - a city that is both musical and cosmopolitan. Nicol Matt and its singers created a strong partnership for their mission in the city's administration, the cultural offices, UNESCO City of Music and the Region of Hannover. The first International Week for Peace is under the patronage of the Lord Mayor of the State Capital Hannover, Belit Onay and the German Commission for UNESCO. In addition, the German Music Council, the Federal Commissioner for Culture and the Media and the Cultural Office of the State capital Hannover are supporting the project.

A CONCERT FOR PEACE

At the very heart of our first International Week for Peace is our Concert for Peace. Join us on August 6th when we will perform **John Rutter's** moving **Requiem**, conducted by the composer himself with the World Orchestra for Peace.

Why August 6th? This is the anniversary of the **Hiroshima** atomic bombing. Hannover and Hiroshima are twinned cities and both are members of the International network Mayors for Peace. For many years, the Hiroshima Memorial Day has taken place in Hannover on August 6th.

Be there this year when **choral singers from over 30 countries worldwide** unite and send a message of peace! Right now, with another terrible war raging in Europe, this is more important than ever. All over the world people will join the gigantic Peace Choir from the comfort of their own homes, connected by modern technology. Goosebumps are guaranteed!

And finally, on the evening of **August 6th**, it will be show-time!
